What's Now and What's Next? by YBhg Tan Sri Abu Kassim Mohamed, National Centre for Governance, Integrity and Anti-Corruption (GIACC)</p> <p>Regulation plays an important role in keeping our economy moving. Effective regulation supports productivity growth, investment and innovation, but poor regulation is frustrating and cumbersome. It slows economic growth and increases the cost of doing business.</p> <p>Regulatory reform refers to concerted effort that improves regulatory quality and enhances the performance, cost-effectiveness of compliance with regulations, or legal quality of regulations and related government formalities. The scope of reforms can encompass the revision of individual regulations, the improvement of processes for making regulations or the rebuilding of an entire regulatory regime and its institutions. It is also directed to making sure that these regulations are fully responsive to changes in the economic, social and technical conditions surrounding them.</p> <p>Competition-enhancing reforms in both the manufacturing and service sectors have been essential to the development and diffusion of new technologies. But as these reforms are also unleashing a new round of technical change, unforeseen side effects and different technology impacts have emerged to again underline the need for regulatory revisions or reform. Regulatory agencies can play an important role in preserving public trust, integrity and order in society.</p>

11.15am - 11.45am	<p>Keynote Speaker 2: From Sectoral to Whole-of-Government Approach on GRP by Nick Malyshev, Head of Regulatory Policy Division, Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)</p> <p>Ensuring the quality of the regulatory structure is a dynamic and permanent role of government that requires a whole-of-government approach, covering all levels of government and across sectors. Assuring high quality regulatory frameworks is critically dependent on the existence of appropriate government commitment and institutions to provide necessary coordination and oversight of good regulatory practice and broader regulatory policy.</p> <p>These institutions need to be transparent and accountable, with mandates and sufficient power to ensure that reform translates into action on the ground. They need to ensure that regulation is part of the policy environment, not simply the tail-end of the process. To meet policy objectives, regulation needs to be integrated into the policy cycle, so it can deliver those objectives.</p>
